Events and Seminars


The Hyderabadi Biryani

A Marvel in Metal

Ever wondered how one could use a piece of metal as a mirror? Well, it is possible! The Aranmula Kannadi – The mirror of Aranmula, is a traditional masterpiece crafted by a few artisans, who alone possess the secret to the mix of the metals.

In Malayalam, "Kannadi" means "mirror." The exact metals used in the alloy are maintained as family secrets; metallurgists suggest that the alloy is a mix of copper and tin, so a type of speculum metal. It is polished for several days to achieve the mirror's reflective surface using an abrasive paste made by mixing rice bran with oil extracted from the seeds of Marotti (Hydnocarpus pentandrus).

Unlike ordinary mirrors, which have a gap between the object and the image, in the Aranmula mirror, there is no gap. It is completely handmade and reflects with zero distortion. Only a few Vishwakarma families in Aranmula, a small town in Kerala, know the secret to craft these 250-300 years old metal mirrors.

Aranmula Kannadi is thought to bring good luck and is widely known not only in India but outside of India as well. Every piece is the result of hours of effort and hard work.

The British Museum in London has an Aranmula mirror 45 centimeters tall in its collection. The mirrors received a geographical indication (GI) tag in 2004-05.

Trek to Nethravathi Peak


Amidst the monsoon and mist, a group of seven colleagues from the Bengaluru Assurance Team decided to embark on an adventure trip after wrapping up the audit season.
