


The Spiritual and Cultural Experience at Udupi

Bhoota Kola stands out due to its vibrant and immersive nature. It symbolizes the local people's devotion and their connection to ancestral spirits, encompassing not just a religious experience but a cultural spectacle that reflects the essence of the coastal community. The participating worshiper, chosen from a hereditary lineage, undergoes a meticulous preparation process before the ritual begins, showcasing a profound respect for the divine and the sacred art of performance. After completing the elaborate makeup and adornment, which involved covering the body with locally sourced materials like coconut leaves, the worshiper sought blessings from both the deity and the priest. This initial phase of worship included honoring important regional deities such as Marlajumadi, Panjurli, and Jumadi Bhanta through a small Pooja. Each ritual act, even the simple adorning of anklets filled with bells, was accompanied by reverence; everything used in the performance was first worshiped. The worshiper, now possessed by the spirit of the deity, danced fervently, communicating joy and concerns on behalf of the community. The rhythm of the bells from the anklets echoed through the air, drawing in the crowd with an almost magnetic pull. This was not merely a performance.

Udupi illuminated the interplay between spirituality and culture, represented beautifully through the Bhoota Kola ritual. The meticulous preparation, the reverent worship, and the evocative performance collectively create an enchanting tapestry that speaks to the heart of the community.




Kedarkantha Snow Trek

Waking in the arms of lush white snow on the first day of 2025... It was a dream come true....

It was a very memorable and joyful moment of my life. I climbed an elevation of about 6,300 feet, beginning at 6,200 feet above sea level and reaching 12,500 feet. I was one of the 30 who managed to reach the summit of Kedarkantha in Uttarakhand, out of a group of 80, and that too well in time before the sunrise

My journey started from Mumbai to Delhi on December 29. I headed to Dehradun from Delhi and took the bus to Sankri base village. After a sound sleep, on the morning of December 31, I started the walk of my life to my dream destination, full of surprises and wonderful scenery. We reached our first halting point and spent the night in a tent surrounded by full, lush, white snow. At 12 a.m., everyone wished each other a Happy New Year amidst mild music and dancing around the tents. Waking up the first morning of the New Year at 9,100 feet above sea level was the perfect moment to cherish. In the morning we resumed our trek to reach the base camp; the actual trek to the summit begins here. On the way, we came across the frozen lake called "Juda ka Talab". After having fun sliding through snow and clicking numerous pictures, we moved forward to the 2nd stop at a height of 11,250 feet. With a few hours of sleep and a quick breakfast, we began our walk early to conquer the peak. After a continuous trek of 3 hours, finally the moment I had been waiting for the last few days arrived. It was around 06.15 when I reached the summit to capture a beautiful shot of the sunrise at a height of 12,500 feet above sea level.

After spending about 90 minutes at the peak, I began the descent and journey back home with loads of beautiful photos and wonderful memories to recall and cherish later in my life and to share with my friends & loved ones.




Mahakal Temple
